#### **2025 IS A ELECTION YEAR**

#### Elections will be held in September 2025 for the following positions:

- Treasurer-Elect, which is a 4-year term: two years as Tresurer-Elect (2026-2027) and then two years as Treasurer (2028-2029)

Beef tallow, a rendered fat from cattle, has made a surprising comeback in the skincare world, fueled in part by the rise of ancestral beauty trends and viral TikTok videos touting its simplicity and skin-loving benefits. Once used in traditional soaps and salves, this old-world ingredient is now praised for its ability to moisturize and support the skin barrier. However, in an industry driven by clinical data and consumer safety, one question remains:

Can this ancient remedy earn its place among modern cosmetic formulations by being effective as well as safe?

From Mesopotamia and Egypt, through Roman hygiene, to folk medicine, tallow's long-standing eligibility as a skincare ingredient is well-rooted in history. Many fat-based cosmetics were used in early Egyptian society, and Greek apothecaries and Roman bathhouses used tallow-based soaps and balms. In fact, the term "stearic" is derived from the Greek stéar, meaning tallow.

An MDPI review on natural ingredient history reports a "cleansing cream was made of animal fat or vegetable oil mixed with powdered lime and perfume". This underscores how early formulations relied on animal fats, such as tallow, for both cleansing and skin protection. The rise of plant oils and petroleum-derived ingredients in the 20<sup>th</sup> century diminished tallow's mainstream use, though artisan and rural traditions kept it alive, and it continues to be studied today.



Most of tallow's success can be traced to its biochemical makeup. It is high in saturated and monounsaturated fats like stearic acid, oleic acid, and palmitic acid, making it similar to the lipid makeup of human sebum.<sup>2,3</sup> It also contains fat-soluble vitamins, such as A, D, E, and K, which may contribute to barrier repair and antioxidant defense.<sup>3</sup>

Reportedly, fatty acid uptake into keratinocytes is transport-mediated and temperature-sensitive. Specifically, we have discovered that there is a higher specificity for uptake into keratinocytes with fatty acids, linoleic acid, and arachidonic acid.<sup>4</sup> Tallow is considered skin-compatible because its fatty acid profile closely resembles that of the skin's natural sebum and lipid barrier. The stratum corneum, the outermost layer of skin, is made up of lipids like cholesterol, ceramides, and free fatty acids, which form a semi-permeable barrier.<sup>4</sup> The lipid composition of tallow may reinforce this matrix, potentially supporting skin hydration, elasticity, and barrier function.<sup>2</sup>

Several studies have also demonstrated that tallow enhances skin hydration due to its rich fatty acid profile. One study found that tallow provided the greatest moisturizing benefit when applied topically, outperforming emulsions modified with xanthan gum or orange fibers. Tallow-derived Engkabang fat esters increased skin hydration by up to 47% over a 180-minute application window, highlighting its potential for sustained moisture delivery.



Additionally, tallow-based soap was shown to have antimicrobial properties, acting as an effective disinfectant without causing the dryness typically associated with conventional soaps and surfactants.<sup>7</sup> This supports the hypothesis that stearic and oleic acid-rich lipids in tallow can help reinforce the skin barrier, improve moisture retention, and contribute to skin health through hydration.

Lastly, the safety of tallow in skincare hinges heavily on its rendering method and post-processing quality. Inadequately rendered animal fat may retain microbial contaminants, residual proteins, or endotoxins. A 2021 study evaluating medicinal soaps found that poorly processed tallow could present microbial and oxidative safety concerns unless properly purified and quality-controlled during manufacturing.<sup>8</sup> This highlights the need for rigorous sourcing and testing, tallow when using particularly formulations.





In conclusion, beef tallow presents an intriguing intersection of historical tradition and modern skin science. However, these benefits are only as good as the quality of the ingredient itself. If not properly rendered and purified, tallow can retain microbial contaminants, endotoxins, or residual proteins. This poses safety risks, especially in leave-on skincare formulations. As interest in tallow-based products grows, formulators must approach its use with both scientific rigor and transparency. When sourced and formulated responsibly, tallow may offer real benefits in skincare, but its safety and efficacy must be supported by research, not just tradition. As a skin-care ingredient that has been around for roughly 3,000 years, it is an exciting prospect to consider where it will be in the next 3,000 years.

Beef tallow may appear sustainable at first glance by supporting a "nose-to-tail" approach, making use of animal parts that would otherwise go to waste.

However, a recent narrative review indicates that sustainability claims can be misleading. While tallow avoids some ecological impacts associated with plantbased oils, it remains tied to livestock production, an industry with considerable greenhouse gas emissions, land use, and ethical concerns. Moreover, ambiguous marketing terms like "grass-fed" or "organic" are poorly regulated and can obscure sourcing practices.9

With a notable history of award-winning formulations and pioneering advanced delivery systems in personal care through multiple patents, he continues to be a driving force propelling the industry forward.

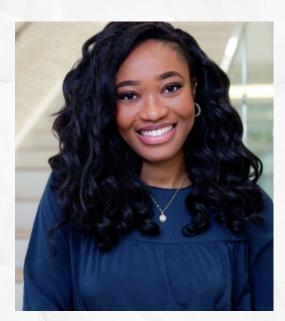


**Charlotte Carter** is Head of U.S. Media for Cetaphil and Differin at Galderma, leading strategy across digital, social, influencer, and paid channels.

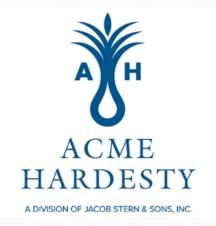

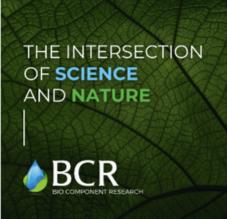
